Mapping Killings under Kim Jong-un: North Korea's Response to International Pressure

This report focuses on Kim Jong-un's rule, which began when his father, Kim Jong-il, died in December 2011. The report presents an in-depth analysis of Hyesan, Ranggang province, showing sites of interest to the project and changes to patterns of state-led killing in the Kim Jong-un era.
